



Dear Governor Evers, Secretary Andrea Palm, Kenya Bright and Joyce Allen,

We are writing to request an emergency waiver to current administrative rules and policies restricting Medicaid reimbursement for telehealth-delivered services. Further, we are requesting that additional Medicaid funding be distributed in order to increase funds for allowing and implementing telehealth services as our communities deal with the COVID - 19 pandemic. We are also requesting that Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) expand funding to not only include in-person services, but also telehealth-delivered services. This is an unprecedented event, and we believe the state must take this bold action in order to save lives and maintain an emotionally healthy community.

During this time, the level of anxiety, isolation and trauma is at an all-time high, as individuals deal with social distancing, school closings, and employment losses. All of these factors lead to tremendous stress and increased need for behavioral health support. Many folks will not seek out in-person services due to their level of fear in contracting the virus. In-person treatment also puts our therapists, clinicians, social workers, and peer support providers at a much higher risk of contracting the virus as well.

While there are now multiple resolutions and orders to practice social distancing in order to reduce community spread, an individual's need for treatment doesn't cease. It is critical to take creative approaches to decrease human contact, but still help people get their needs met during this challenging time. Discontinuing access to treatment when people need it the most could have a devastating impact, and could even lead to unnecessary deaths by suicide or overdose.

Last, many behavioral health providers must have sustained funding to ensure the ongoing existence of their organizations. At a time when we are just beginning to see the positive impact of expanding behavioral services throughout our communities, it would be a significant setback to lose programs and agencies due to bureaucratic red tape.

This is a time for us to come together, to take bold action and to fight for every life regardless of personal circumstance. Please heed our request and grant an emergency waiver, so that our administration can release additional Medicaid funding in order to provide telehealth services in the state of Wisconsin.
